



The Dickason Drive is an example of a pleasure drive in which well turned out families take to the streets to see the sights and one another. The driver has to be skilled to be admired and the horses fit for the trip. The Driver's Test is designed to test the skill and fitness of each turnout and driver requiring halts, rein backs, tight circles and a brisk controlled walk.
